BACKGROUND

As Lead Agency of the UN Decade of Education for Sustainable Development (DESD, 2005-2014), UNESCO is organizing a side event on Education for Sustainable Development at the 5th Tokyo International Conference on African Development (TICAD V). Moving towards sustainable development in Africa cannot be achieved by political agreements, financial incentives or technological solutions alone. Sustainable development requires changes in how we think and act. This is where Education for Sustainable Development has a crucial role to play. More and more governments have started investing in Education for Sustainable Development as a strategy to build sustainable and resilient societies.
