In this lecture Dr. Ebtekar will focus on our planet's environmental challenges and progress, particularly through the lens of Iran and the broader Middle East, where three decades of conflicts and political unrest have taken a massive toll on natural resources and related economies. Dr. Ebtekar will highlight the central roles that peace, human rights and international dialogue must play in efforts to create sound environmental policies. She will provide important perspectives on urbanization and efforts towards sustainable urban environmental policy.

For anyone with an interest in environmental governance — particularly that of the contemporary Middle East — and its links to social change and international cooperation, this event should not be missed.
