Symposium at UNU Will Explore the Potential for Green Partnerships

- A vital key to achieving sustainable development for the future will be the building of effective
 partnerships of stakeholders and realizing coordinated actions. This symposium, co-organized by UNUISP and the Japan Ministry of the Environment, looks at the potential for such partnerships following
 on the success of the United Nations Conference on Sustainable Development (Rio+20), held in Rio de
 Janeiro, Brazil, in June 2012.
- In this seminar, experts from government, academia, think tanks, NGOs and the business community
 will share their insights and enrich the debate on innovative forms of partnerships for creating more
 sustainable societies. Participants will consider what forms of partnerships could be most effective in
 overcoming the challenges to comprehensive growth of a green economy and society that promote
 community development and poverty eradication.
- The symposium will feature three keynote speakers: Mr. Rodrigo Mendes Araujo, Secretary at Brazilian Embassy in Japan, Head of Science and Technology & Environment Section, Embassy of Brazil; Prof. Sarath B.S. Abayakoon, University of Peradeniya (Sri Lanka); and Mr. Makoto Nagasawa, Representative Director, FRUTAFRUTA, Inc. These keynote presentations will be followed by a discussion among panelists from the UNU Institute for Sustainability and Peace, Seikei University, Kyoto University, the Institute for Global Environmental Strategies, Hokkaido University, the Environmental Partnership Council, and Ministry of the Environment in Japan.
