Why: The most recent IPCC report indicates that no continent is untouched by climate change impacts. This joint policy brief between the United Nations University and the Nansen Initiative comes at a milestone period, as countries have begun submitting their National Adaptation Plans (NAPs) for initial feedback and are preparing for an international climate agreement in Paris 2015.
