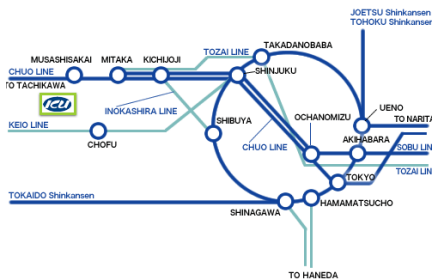
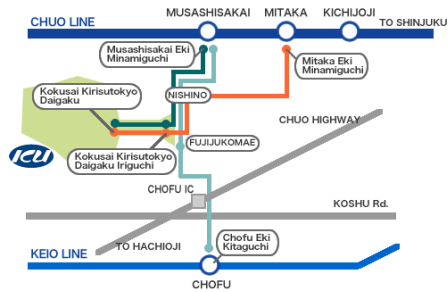


Human Security represents a 'widening' and 'deepening' of security intended in part to cope with the problems caused by globalization. This is evident in the ground-breaking 1994 Human Development Report and the Final Report of the Commission on Human Security (CHS), headed by Amartya Sen and Sadako Ogata. Human Security, the authors of the Final report argued, needs to take into account 'freedom from want, freedom from fear and freedom to take action on one's own behalf'. The objective of Human Security, it was argued, should be to protect 'the vital core of all human lives in ways that enhance human freedoms and human fulfillment' (CHS 2003). In recent years, this 'vital core' of human lives has been threatened by a combination of man-made and natural disasters which has led to increased human insecurity in both North and South. The global financial crisis has resulted in a 'savage sorting of winners and losers' (Sassen 2011) on a global scale. In Japan last year, a natural disaster of unprecedented proportions hit the Tohoku region sweeping away families, homes and entire communities. The devastation wrought by the tsunami was compounded in Fukushima by the meltdown of nuclear reactors which exposed the entire Kanto area to radiation. As in the financial crisis, many were uprooted from their homes and effectively 'expelled' from the region of their birth. In the process, people became less secure and more *resilient*. Restoring a sense of 'security' among the Japanese population and wider global community remains an urgent task and will be the main focus of this international symposium.
