VISA REQUIREMENT

Please ensure that your travel document has a minimum 6 month validity period beyond the scheduled date of departure from New Delhi.

Citizens of all countries require a valid passport and an appropriate visa. Visa must be obtained abroad from an Indian Mission. If you are planning to visit neighbouring countries, such as Nepal and Bhutan, and then re-entering India, a double/multiple entry visa should be obtained. Participants from Nepal and Bhutan do not require visa.



HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

You are strongly advised to obtain international travel and medical insurance to cover the period from your departure for the meeting until the time of your return.

TERI University disclaims all responsibility for medical accident and travel insurance, for compensation, death or disability, loss or damage to personal property and for any other costs or losses that may be incurred during travel time or the period of participation in the meeting.

For entry into New Delhi a valid yellow fever certificate is mandatory for all persons (including infants) who have been, even in transit, in Africa or South Africa or Papua New Guinea ten days prior to their arrival.

The certificate becomes valid 10 days after vaccination. India does not require immunization against small pox or cholera.
