GCM Participates in 'Migration in Countries in Crisis' Initiative

UNU-GCM Director Parvati Nair moderated a session on 'Integrating Migrants in Recovery and Development Assistance', which took place at the international consultation of the Migrants in Countries in Crises (MICIC) Initiative in Geneva on March 16-17 2016. The MICIC Initiative is led by the International Organization for Migration (IOM). This consultation with international organizations, hosted by the Missions of the United States of America and the Philippines in Geneva, was part of a series of inclusive, multi-stakeholder consultations to work with governments, international organizations, civil society and private sector actors to develop a set of guidelines and to share good practices to better protect migrants caught in countries in crisis.
