

Poster Guidelines

1. Size of the Poster: 841mm (W) x 1189mm (H) (A0 Size; Portrait)

2. The poster should include:
 - Logo of your institution
 - Title of the Study
 - Author: your name, faculty advisor's name, names of collaborators (if any), and affiliation of all authors
 - Introduction and Objectives
 - Methods
 - Results or Findings
 - Discussion
 - Summary/Conclusions
 - Acknowledgments

3. Text:
 - Arrange your material in a logical progression
 - Arrange material in columns
 - Avoid including too much information on the poster
 - Use only 2 or 3 colors
 - Choose a font size and style that can be read easily from several feet away
 - Avoid large blocks of text and limit or eliminate jargon and technical terms
 - Organize and reduce text by using subheadings, key words, bullet points
 - Consider that a figure or graph often conveys information more efficiently than paragraphs of text

4. Figures and Graphs:
 - Images should be at least 100dpi and the same size they will be on the poster. A resolution of 150dpi is ideal (smaller resolution will result in a pixelated image, and larger resolution will result in excessive file size).
 - Avoid "chart junk": 3-D, shadowing, multiple grid lines, labeling every tick mark
