What is 'nexus'?

- □ Latin, 'nexus'
 - Act of tying together or something which binds.
 In Japanese,「連環」「関連」「関連性」
- Nexus approach (Hoff 2011)
 - that integrates management and governance across sectors and scales
 - that reduces trade-offs and builds synergies across sectors
- Definition of nexus
 - Not agreed (yet) internationally or academically.

Nexuses paid attention to

Food-energy (UNU'80s), Water-food-trade (World bank'90s), Water-energy-food (Bonn conference2011, RIHN2013-), Water-land-energy (SEI), Water-soil-waste (UNU-FLORES2014), Energy-Environment-Ecosystems (3E Nexus Initiative PJ, Takeuchi), Resource nexus (UNEP IRP)

Features

- Context of development
- Content of international trade



Why now, 'nexus'?

- Context of development: boosted pressures and worsened problems Integrated solution for satisfying human needs and reducing environmental pressures
 - Ensuring accessibility to food, water, energy, etc.
 - Competition among resource developers, increased pressures of using multiple resources.
 - Resulting environmental pressures
- Context of international trade:Control of embedded environmental burdens
 - Virtual water etc. has raised awareness.
 - Reduction of burdens through globalized supply chains.

Highly related to SDG12:

Sustainable consumption and production

- Expectation for stakeholders
 - Business: "Responsible procurement and production" of raw materials and products
 Information provision to consumers
 - Consumers: Practice of "Responsible consumption" (National/local governments included)
 - Administration NPO: Information provision and awareness arising of environmental pollution and social issues outside
 Japan caused by Japan's activities through supply chains
