This project explores and expounds on the role of data (especially social indicators) towards individuals development and wellbeing; supporting and catalyzing community-level action towards the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs); democratizing social indicators monitoring by highlighting and demonstrating the role of the bottom-up, micro-level, citizen-generated data to complement the official social indicators; and enhancing trust in social indicators data. #### Responsibilities:

Under the guidance and direct supervision of the hosting Principal Research Fellow and the Director of UNU-CS, successful candidates shall be entrusted with the following tasks:

- Work within the Data and Sustainable Development research project contributing to the effort towards the project goals.
- Engaging in research on the specific research areas and activities identified and agreed on with the project leader.
- Contribute to producing publications and communication materials based on the research work undertaken while at UNU-CS.
- Contribute to the life of the institution and participate in events and activities, such as seminars, presentations, or meetings.
- Reside full-time in Macau for the duration of the contract.
- Performing any other tasks as may be assigned by the Director.

#### **Required Qualifications and Competencies:**

- A Master's degree in the areas relevant to the ICTD, or a Bachelor's degree with three or more years
  of advanced or specialized experience.
- Proficiency with mixed method research approaches employing both qualitative and quantitative methods.
- Excellent communication skills, with proficiency in both oral and written English and strong academic writing skills.
- Good team player with strong interpersonal skills demonstrated by the ability to work in a multi-cultural, multi-ethnic environment with sensitivity and respect for diversity.
- Passion for the mission of the United Nations and UNU-CS.
- The ability to engage actively, creatively and imaginatively for the benefit of UNU-CS research.

#### Remuneration:

Remuneration will be at MOP\$16,465 per month and rent-free housing (excluding utilities) as living support will be offered to the selected candidate.

UN income is not subject to taxes in Macau. The contractor will be responsible for paying local taxes and other fiscal obligations.

This is a locally recruited post; no relocation allowances apply. The successful candidate will be employed under Personnel Service Agreement (PSA) and will not hold international civil servant status, nor is he/she a "staff member" as defined in the United Nations Staff Rules and Regulations.

#### **Duration of contract:**

This is a full-time position on short-term Personnel Service Agreement (PSA) for six (6) months with UNU, with the possibility for renewal subject to performance and funding availability. The combined duration of appointments under PSA contract is not exceeding six (6) years.
